

# Activities

## Muddit Making

- 1- In a mud pit, make lots of gooey mud with water
- 2- Get children to slap mud onto a tree to create any face like creature they wish.  
(you might need to have some dry dirt on standby to pat on top).
- 3- Add natural resources, ie leaves, twigs, stones etc.
- 4- Give it a name



## Stick Whittling

- 1- Get children to find lots of interesting sticks.
- 2- Using an old potato peeler to shave sticks until they are smooth.

## Story Telling

- 1- Children to create a story telling mat.
- 2- Use a familiar story or create their own to make a mat of any shape.
- 3- Use natural resources to add detail and express their feelings.
- 4- Get children to act out story map to an audience.



## The Biscuit Game, as suggested by Maciver (2013)

- 1- Balance a biscuit (chocolate ones are best) on your forehead.
- 2- Using your facial movements try to get the biscuit to your mouth and at the biscuit, without using your hands.

## Spiders and Flies, as suggested by Maciver (2013)

- 1 Establish the boundaries
- 2 Nominate a spider
- 3 Everyone else stand at base i.e a tree (here they are safe).
- 4 Spider shouts "Fly little flies (Everyone must fly flapping their arms).
- 5 If they are tagged by the spider the fly must stop and are now stuck to the spot (they have now become part of the spider's webs and can move and flap their arms to take the other files).
- 6 The spider keeps shouting out "Fly Little flies" until all are stuck in the web and the last fly is the winner.
