We would like to apologise for the low temperatures in the hall recently. The room is heated by a ground source heat pump which is not working effectively and it has been difficult to find an engineer who is qualified to repair it. #### **Parking**

Please can we remind all parents not to park across the white lines denoting a dropped kerb in the village. Blocking these areas makes access to the pavements difficult for parents with children in buggies. Thank you for your co-operation.

#### **Head Lice**

We continue to have children coming to school with Head Lice. Please ensure you check your child's hair regularly and treat if necessary.

#### Water bottles in school

Please remember children are expected to have only water in bottles. We cannot accept any hot drinks in school due to health and safety guidance. Thank you for your understanding.

#### **Back Door**

The back door has been fixed. Please can we all be vigilant in ensuring all outside doors are kept closed and locked so there is no access to the school during school hours and that at pick up time only the designated exits are open, not classroom doors. The gates are opened at 3pm for sunflowers so doors must be locked.

#### **Uniform**

It has been noticed that some children are coming to school in clothes which are not part of our uniform (including red socks for example). If needed, you can find a selection of second hand uniform hanging in our reception area which you are free to make use of. Donations welcome, payable to the office.

#### Menu choices

Please could you ensure your child knows their choice of dinner, sometimes parentpay and register do not match. For example, one menu choice is jacket potato with sausage and veg, there is confusion as children think they are having just jacket potato. Thank you for your help.
