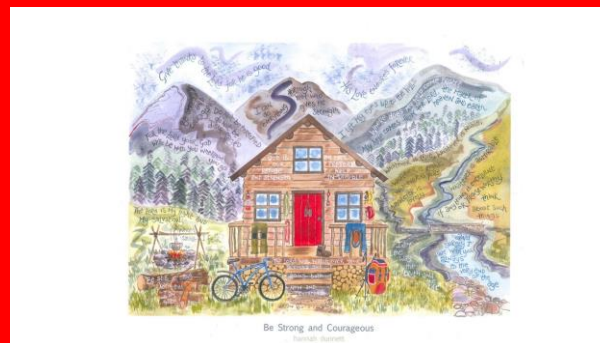
there but I have seen the videos taken by the staff and am so proud of all of the children who truly lived out our vision in their performances.

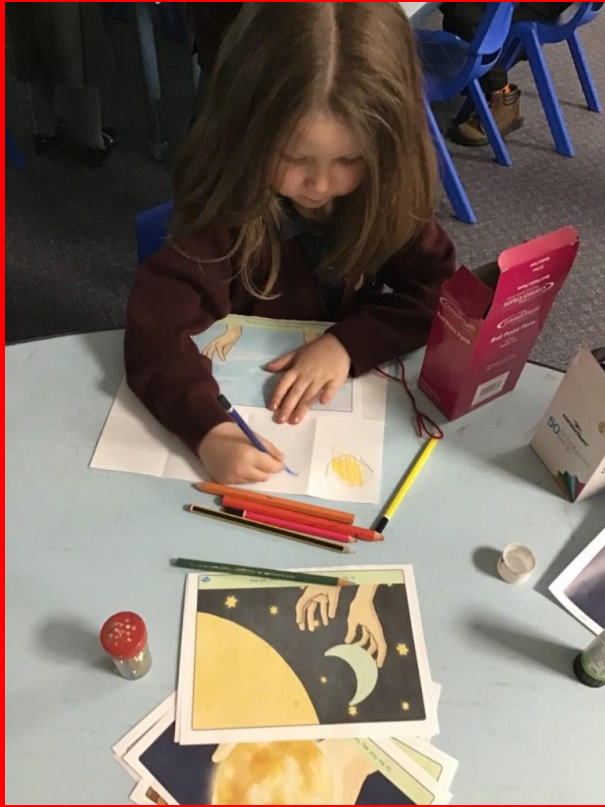

A huge well done to our Year 6's who took the KS2 SATs papers the other week. The countdown is on to the end of your primary school journey. Enjoy the last half term!

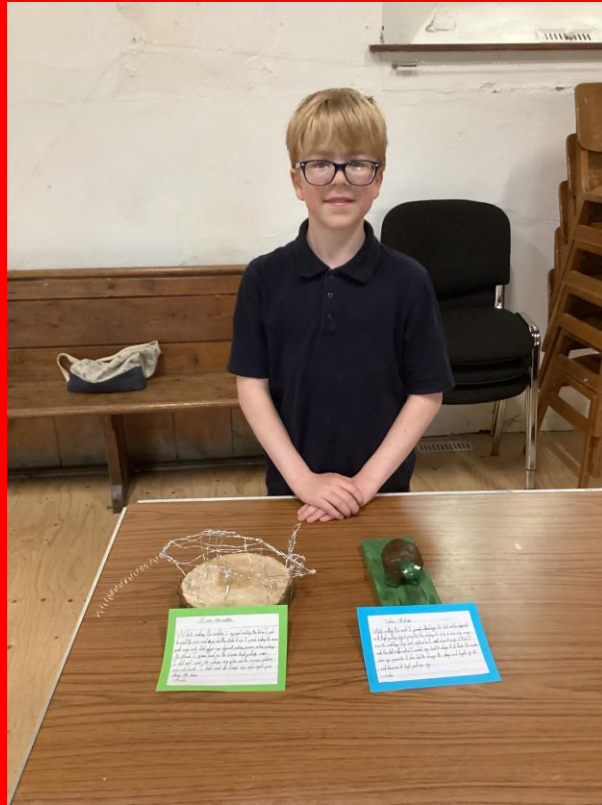

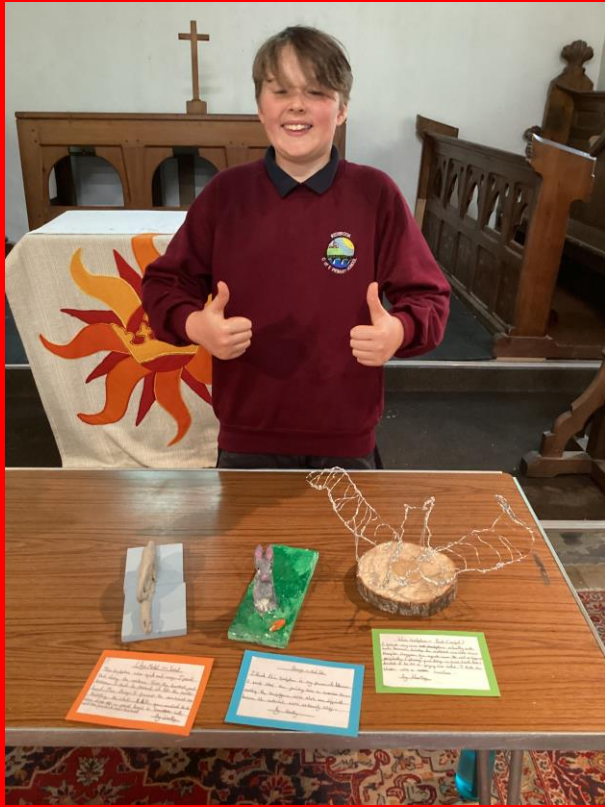
We have also just started reading our summer performance script – 'The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse'. More information to follow!
