# **Robin Class**



Robins have had a fantastic start to 2024, the children have shown such enthusiasm for their learning and we have covered so much in just 5 weeks! We have enjoyed welcoming new children into our class, taking us up to 17 children.

In English, the children loved writing to Sunny the Meerkat, linked to our key text of Meerkat Mail. They used exclamations and questions in their writing; used subordination to give further detail and wrote in the first person using 'I'. We are now reading all about The Great Fire of London, linking in with our History topic, which the children have LOVED getting stuck into! They have been so engaged, wanting to find out more about Samuel Pepys Diary and how people lived after the fire. I'm sure they will have so many facts to share in their writing, after half term!

Reception have been reading Mr Gumpy's Outing and The Train Ride this half term, as well as learning all about Chinese New Year this week. They have enjoyed beginning to write sentences, using the phonics sounds they have learnt. They have engaged in a variety of activities, both adult led and child initiated. They have made vehicles using iPad boxes, a picnic for Mr Gumpy and Dragons to celebrate Chinese New Year, to name a few!


The children have thoroughly enjoyed our Art topic of printmaking, using a variety of mediums including leaves, bark, shells and Duplo to create prints and different patterns. In Science, Year 1 have been learning all about our 5 senses, including using their taste to identify which foods taste salty, bitter, sour, sweet or savoury! Year 2 have been finding out all about animals and their habitats, life cycles and matching adults to their offspring.

Robins love being outside and PE lessons are firm favourites of the week! The children have begun to take part in invasion games, using dodgeballs and bean bags. Their balance and co-ordination is coming along wonderfully, as well as their ability to work together as a team.

Robins will enjoy a well earned Marble jar treat this Thursday, as part of their collective treat for working so hard this half term. I continue to be very proud of them all.



# **Kingfisher Class**



What a whirlwind of a half term! It's been short, yet sweet, and the Kingfishers have managed to cram in a significant amount of learning.

In English we have continued with a narrative focus this half term, applying what we learnt last half term, as well as adding in a few new features. The children have really engaged with our focus text 'The Iron Man', which has helped inspire some fantastic mystery writing. Their success criteria (for within their writing) included; using short, snappy sentences to move the story along quickly and create suspense, use of senses to connect with the reader and describing physical reactions from the characters. They have loved letting their imaginations loose!

History got us feeling a little bit dramatic and we do have some very talented actors and actresses. The Vikings has been a popular topic but we've talked specifically about fact and fiction – there are a lot of myths surrounding the Vikings that aren't actually true. Using this, we've developed our understanding about whether all sources of information are reliable and found that primary sources tend to be more reliable than secondary ones.


This half term we have combined music and dance, culminating in a wonderful dance festival lead by 'Dance Queens' at Parkend. The children had a great day! '




# **Curry Night!**
