This half term, Year 1 have enjoyed exploring the story The Day the Crayons Quit by Drew Daywalt. The lesson hook saw the children receive a letter from our classroom chairs, which captured their imaginations! From there, the children have done hot-seating, wrote a range of sentences, including exclamations, questions, statements and commands. They have also written a persuasive letter, choosing a classroom object to encourage other children to use them and why!

Reception have enjoyed exploring the text Mr Gumpy's Outing. They have been using their phonics to sound out and write words to form a sentence, linked to the story! They have also made their own role play boat, created their own small world scenes with animals from the story and talked about which animal is their favourite and why.

In maths, Year 1 have been learning about the properties of shape, measurement and have recently started number and place value: numbers to 40. They have also been practising their number formation and number bonds in their maths jotters.

Reception have learnt all about numbers to 10, recognising the composition of these numbers and practising number sentences. They have enjoyed measuring ingredients to make playdough and

experimenting with different amounts of water outside, discussing which containers hold more and less.

On Monday, 23rd January, we took part in lots of Chinese New Year activities. The children enjoyed finding out about each of the Zodiac animals and making their own dragon, which they danced with in a parade with the Kingfisher children! They learnt about how people welcome in and celebrate Chinese New Year through video & discussion. We are very grateful to parents and Miss Chambers for donating some Chinese food for us to sample. We had duck pancakes, Gong Bao chicken & prawn crackers, to name a few!

Robins have really enjoyed their outdoor learning experiences this half term. Using the Church grounds, the children have learnt about different types of seeds and birds, made birds nests with a range of materials and made observations in their journals. Thank you Cati, Louise, Aimee & Nicola for giving your time, the children talk really positively of their learning that takes place during the sessions.

I can't believe how quickly the end of the half term is upon us. Over the last few weeks highlights for the Kingfishers have included the pleasure of swimming lessons, learning to play the cornet and creating PowerPoint presentations.

Courtesy of Gloucestershire Music, the children have had the pleasure of learning how to play the cornet, including reading music such as the names and meanings of the notes. Tuesday afternoons have become particularly loud at Redbrook! Cornet lessons continue for another few weeks after the half term break.





Swimming lessons have been a great success and the children have been a credit to the school whilst off site. Many of the children have made great progress with their swimming skills, building confidence in the pool.

In computing, the children have being learning how to research a subject by using the internet and putting what they have learnt into a PowerPoint presentation. They have created a range of different slideshows on various subjects and presented these to their classmates and the Robins. The children have learnt more about the software, such as how to animate their presentations, insert pictures and change fonts, alongside building important research skills, including picking out the essential information and putting it into their own words.





We also thoroughly enjoyed celebrating Lunar New Year on Monday 23rd January. The children learnt more about the traditions and stories to do with Lunar New Year and finished the day with some Chinese cuisine! A special thank you to those parents who were able to contribute items.
