

PTA NEWS SUMMER 21

...There will no doubt be much talk of the disruption the pandemic has caused to all of us so I'll leave that to the experts and concentrate on what we've actually achieved. Which is no small thing by the way!

With the lack of our usual fundraising opportunities we had to exercise our grey matter and think of COVID safe (winner of the most dreaded expression of the year) events and projects during both lockdown and as the restrictions gradually lightened. So we had a socially distanced **treasure hunt** and a **virtual balloon race** – not money spinners but just something to keep our hand in. Mud and lost wellies aside they were good fun (the kids still won prizes so they were happy!). We managed a couple of Rags2Riches collections – extra handy when the charity shops weren't receiving donations. Once we'd worked out how to manage the cake sales we started running those again so every class had a chance to hold one (albeit in the short space of one term rather than spread out through the year!). I think we've all benefited from the Friday afternoon treats.... (FYI classes have the choice whether to keep the money raised at their sale for classroom extras or to add it to the larger PTA pot for the ongoing bigger projects).

We organised **Escape Room games** (solving puzzles in small teams for those who aren't familiar with the format) for the older children which went down a storm and are definitely something we'd do again. It was just too difficult to do something for the younger ones BUT we will make up for it as soon as we can. Tell the children to polish up their skills as the Talent Shows will return with a vengeance!

And we come to the **Sponsorathon** which absolutely floored me with its success – both financially and with the amount of fun and enthusiasm with which it was met! So Daisies and Poppies had a Fun Run; Speedwell had an obstacle course to overcome and Foxglove completed a survival skills day. **Your amazing children raised about £3.5k.** Phenomenal! This meant that the maths resources the school had requested help with were covered and we also made a huge splash in our Trim Trail project pot. (All these figures will be distributed at the AGM in September so you can see the ins and outs of the fundraising efforts).

Alongside these achievements our luck kicked in and we won £150 in a draw ran by the company who organised the online Panto we had access to at Christmas. We wanted to spend this money at a local business and use it for a treat for the children and staff. After a committee discussion we decided that we would use it to buy ice creams (or sorbets) for all the school from Chase Farm (who produce unbelievable icy products!). I'm hoping we can have these at the Back to School BBQ before we start back in September. Our second win happened when a keen eyed parent (thanks Jade!) entered us into the Pips Organic Sports Day Competition and we were one of only ten schools in the country to win a massive package of Pip's fruity water drinks! Apparently they were delicious!

The PTA is a really important part of the school community from organising events and fundraising to volunteering to help at school. Our match funding promise enabled the Japanese week the children have enjoyed this term; the Scholastic Book Fair we run gives the school the chance to top up the library; the children's events give them a chance to enjoy time with the school friends outside the classroom (as with the parent's events!).
