In mathematics, we've focused on building strong foundational skills that will support our students in future learning.

Science lessons this term have been especially exciting, with hands-on experiments planned for all year groups. We encourage you to engage in discussions at home about what they are learning—curiosity is a powerful tool!

During the second week back, we have our autumn term parents' evenings, these are a great opportunity to discuss your child's progress with their teacher and we look forward to welcoming you all into school. Please do contact the office if you still need to make an appointment.

Your involvement in our school community has been as strong as ever. We have welcomed parents, grandparents and community volunteers into school to support us with reading, choir and of course

our gardening club in preparation for Malvern this term. Sunflowers



This term we have welcomed many new children into Sunflowers and with the support of the returning children they have already settled in extremely well.

This term we have been focusing on kindness, respect and sharing. The children are really developing these skills well and we have seen many independent examples of these in the children's play.









The children have also been looking at extending their maths skills. We have been looking at number recognition and number lines, numbers on a dice in table top games and PE, measuring using blocks, shape recognition and pattern making.









When discussing harvest, one of the core texts was Little Red Hen. This sparked a big interest in windmills and how they work. We made our own paper windmills and made our own bread hedgehog rolls, again using our maths and sharing skills.







During our Pre-school afternoons we are supporting the children with their road safety skills.



Bluebell Class



We have had a very busy start to the term and all the children have settled well into our school routines. Bluebell reception children have been exploring the topic of 'What Makes Me Me' and have celebrated differences, found out that not everybody enjoys the same things and explored how it's good to be an individual. We read lots of lovely texts where the characters are all different from the norm, but are proud to be who they are, such as 'Elmer', 'Julian is a Mermaid' and 'Croc and Bird' as well as many others.

Year 1 have had a very busy term finding out about holidays in the past, cave paintings and seasonal changes in the environment. We have followed their lead in literacy and are producing some lovely leaflets about hibernating animals, as this is an area they are particularly interested in.

As always, if anyone is having a clear out of good quality books or toys we are always grateful to receive donations. Next term we are finding out about space amongst other things. We will be reading 'Look Up' by Nathan Bryan and 'Astro Girl' by Ken Wilson-Max. If any of you have a telescope or anything astronaut related we could borrow for dressing up, we would be very grateful.

We all love our Forest School sessions and we have been spotting changes in nature as the winter is approaching. Foxglove Class


