
Robin Class



This half term, Robins have enjoyed exploring our key texts. Year 1 have been reading The Fire Children & Why Elephant has a Trunk. They have compared the similarities and differences of the texts, painted pictures linked to their favourite parts & have even created their own story with a twist! Reception have been looking at The Tiny Seed (fiction) and It All Starts with a Seed (nonfiction). They have enjoyed finding out about the journey that seeds go on, from being planted in the ground all the way through to becoming a big, beautiful flower. All of the children have enjoyed planting seeds of their own, caring for them & watching them grow.



In maths recently, Reception have been exploring 3D shapes. We did an experiment to see which shapes would roll or slide down a ramp! We have also been building towers with shapes and making patterns. The children have enjoyed exploring number bonds to 5 and 10, finding many ways of showing this. Year 1 have been using bears & bugs to help them form multiplication and division number sentences. They have talked about the total amount and how we can make equal groups of objects to help us find the answer.













We have had lots of fun outside this half term. With the warmer weather in sight, we have been making great use of our outdoor area & our local surroundings. We went for a walk down to the Green, to look for signs of Spring. We all enjoyed a day to St Briavels School, linked with our Malvern Garden Project. The children worked so well with the children from St Briavels and created some fantastic pieces, some of which will appear in the Garden itself! As part of our outdoor learning, Robins have been busy weaving willow branches to create fences, which will also go into the Malvern Garden.

We enjoyed a visit to Forest Holidays in Christchurch this week. The children enjoyed den building, collecting items from the woodland to create a picture & marshmallow toasting, to name a few! Thank you so much to Katalin (Aryan's Mum) for organising this trip. We all had a super time!











We are really enjoying having our pre-school children joining us every Friday morning between 9.30 and 11am, for stories, songs & play. Kingfisher Class



This half term, Kingfishers have been working really hard in their English lessons to produce a class book of non-chronological reports about deep sea creatures - created by themselves! The children were inspired by the book 'Blue Planet II' and even wrote to the author and illustrator at the BBC, giving their opinions on the book and asking them questions. Their deep sea creatures were so creative and have been published as a class book within the classroom for everyone to read.

The children have also been learning about map skills in geography, learning to locate oceans and continents, read grid references and map symbols and name and follow directions of the 8 points on a compass.

In music, the children have been learning to play the cornet/ trumpet through lessons from Gloucestershire Music Service. Although this was challenging for many children, they showed great resilience and performed a fantastic mini concert, open to all of their parents and carers.

This week, the children have been lucky enough to spend the morning with some forest rangers, building some impressive shelters in the woods and toasting some marshmallows over a firepit!

Finally, a huge congratulations to both the year 6 girls football team, who won their match earlier this half term, and to our year 5 Nature Quiz team who did an amazing job learning and revising nature facts with Mrs Evans at such short notice. They did exceptionally well in the quiz and we are awaiting the results to see if we are into the next round.

Malvern Garden Competition Update



On Friday 10th March we held a very successful Malvern Fundraiser. The Pig Race was attended by about 80 people and we raised just under £600! Thank you so much to all the people who worked so hard to make it a great success and congratulations if your pig won its race!

On Friday 24th March we held a Federation Malvern Day. We spent the day looking at our garden plan and participating in a selection of activities related to our Grimm's fairy tale garden.

We painted name stones to lay in the path of the Rumpelstiltskin garden; we painted wooden sweets for the gingerbread house in Hansel and Gretel's garden; we planted beans for the Beanstalk in Jack and the Beanstalk; we made mosaics of our footprints to match the Giant footprint for the garden; we made dragonflies to hover around the pond in the frog prince garden; we made bird feeders to hang in the garden; we created a wolf's head for Red Riding Hood's garden and designed a patchwork quilt for the wolf's bed; we sketched portraits of Red Riding Hood and Granny for her bedroom shelves; we chose images and words from each story to go onto the large book pages separating our gardens; and we researched wormeries as the base of Rapunzel's tower will contain a working wormery!

As you can imagine by the end of the day we were exhausted but, hopefully, now we all know a lot more about our school's entry to the Malvern Garden Show- "How Grimm is our garden?"
