Dear Families,

This term in our worships, we have been thinking about how being resilient can help us to achieve more. We have learnt about a range of people who have all shown great resilience in their personal stories, from Malala to Harry Kane and a host of other people whose stories have inspired many. We have thought about how being resilient is like being a bouncy ball that springs back up after being dropped, or being strong enough to "bounce back" from tough times. We also know that keeping going when things are tricky is important as that helps us to learn. A key feature of many of the stories we have heard is that we must work hard and never give up hope. Resilience is one of our school values and we work to develop this in all of our children as we know that it will aid them greatly not only in school but in life beyond our school doors.

This week, we have also thought about Children's Mental Health week in our classrooms. The theme this year is belonging and what that means to children. With 41 children now being in our school, belonging is all the more important to us and we want our children to feel that they belong to our school community where they are loved, respected and celebrated for being themselves.

Part of our wider community is our wonderful PTA who work hard to raise funds and put on events for our children and families. We are always grateful for all they do and give back to the school – thank you to all that are involved, I am truly grateful of your support.

What a fun and busy first half term of the year! The children have settled back into their routines brilliantly.

Year 2, along with Year 3, have enjoyed exploring the texts 'Grandad's Camper' and 'If all the world were'. They've done some fantastic writing to describe the characters, using expanded noun phrases, prepositions and commas in a list. They enjoyed writing their own sequel stories to 'Grandad's Camper', demonstrating the key skills they had learnt!

In Maths, Year 2 have enjoyed learning all about money. They have discovered the many ways they can make £1, as well as adding pounds and pence. Some children enjoyed a trip to the Redbrook shop, to buy ingredients for wrap 'taste testing' that afternoon. They had a £10 budget and enjoyed seeing what items they could buy, and working out the change they would be given!

Computing has been a big hit this half term, with a focus on programming. Both Years 1 and 2 have been busy coding and de-bugging, to make sure their programme has worked effectively. In Music, they have enjoyed learning about a range of percussion instruments and finding out the difference between the beat and rhythm. They recently made their own 'rhythm grids', to play to their friends using claves.

Reception and Year 1 have enjoyed reading and acting out 'Max's Adventures'. They've drawn and written about his adventures, described where they like to go on a walk and talked about how Max felt when he went back home. The magnetic tiles have been a firm favourite with the children this half term, and they have used them in a multitude of ways - ramps, sky scrapers and garages being a few! The children have also enjoyed experimenting with ice and learning about why it melts. They tested different objects to see which float and which sink.

We hope you have a lovely half term break!

Kingfisher Class

Another very busy half term! We started the New Year with a bang and some exciting news from me! A big thank you to everyone for their kind words, thoughts, support and understanding – it is very much appreciated.

January seems to have flown by this year. The children have thoroughly enjoyed their History topic; Egyptians. We've enjoyed learning about Ancient Egyptian hieroglyphs, writing our own names and codes to be cracked, as well as learning about the pharaohs, mummification and their gods. We even played a mummy game, wrapping one another in toilet paper – not like the Egyptians did it at all! It has also linked to our most recent English text. Inspired by this, Y4, 5 and 6 have been learning to use appropriate grammar and vocabulary necessary for fantastic stories about 'The Curse of Tutankhamun'.

The children have also been enjoying our music topic this half term; rhythm grids. We've loved using different body percussion as well as a range of percussion instruments, creating our own rhythms and recording them with symbols. We worked in different pairs, groups and as a whole to explore texture, layering different rhythms on top of one another.

This half term in worship, we've been focusing on our school value 'resilience'. We included this in our well-being sessions and looked at the song, 'The Roses of Success' from Chitty Chitty Bang Bang! The children created their own 'roses of success', thinking about what is resilience and what helps us to be resilient.

Finally, a big well done to our Year 6s who sat another set of practice SATs in preparation for May.












World Book Day
